
Community prevention programs

- Mutual tolerance








Sequential prevention as a model

Focus: Primary prevention





Methods



- Group work small groups (up to 8)
- Friendly atmosphere
- Confidence and trust
- Adolescents and pre-adolescents
- 1500 youngsters a year
- 22 schools
- Development of conversation and dialogue between peers and important adults
- Successful communication techniques
- Conflict resolution and solving problems
- Respect of y.p. needs
- Network of school counselling services



Growing Up & Us



- Be able to speak out typical adolescent topics
 - Mutual respect (solidarity, empathy...)
 - Encouraging interpersonal relations
 - To promote successful behaviours
 - To stimulate non-formal peer to peer education on social inclusion
 - Information on social services for young people in a community

Youth participation project


- Selfiniciative project
